Domestic Missionaries of Saint Thorlák

The Domestic Missionaries of St. Thorlák are missionaries-in-place whose work is to pray from where we are, in our current circumstances, in our present states of body and mind. We are "domestic," meaning, staying in place; we pray from wherever we are able to be, transforming "everywhere" into one, common household, one family of God: "Domestic" Missionaries of St. Thorlák do our work from within the "home" of God's Household. This Domestic form of missionary work differs from that of missionaries who leave home to do their work elsewhere, publicly.

Our Missionary focus is *prayer* in any way we are capable, including all forms of communication: fully spoken, low speaking, variably spoken and non-speaking. Our prayer takes the form of however we best express our hearts and intentions to God, in the place best suited to our abilities: at home, in chapel, outdoors; standing, kneeling, sitting, walking; wherever we connect fully with God at any given moment. Many Domestic Missionaries spend their time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, but others may pray better in motion. Some "practice the presence of God" throughout the day, offering as we go, and some simply focus on the breath in prayer (e.g., breathe in "My Jesus," breathe out "Mercy") to create a "chapel of the heart" wherever we happen to be. Domestic Missionary prayer deliberately minimizes physical and social demands to keep our efforts focused on prayer.

Within this guidebook will be suggested prayers for your consideration and use as they are helpful. While the methods each missionary uses will be those best suited to their means of expression, the <u>intentions</u> of our prayers will be the uniform, specific, and consistent among missionaries. These are also outlined in this guide.

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Domestic Missionaries of Saint Thorlák Prayer Intentions

1) For the Bishop, priests, deacons, seminarians, acolytes, and consecrated religious in Iceland.

May they abandon themselves to the will of God the Father and receive the consolation of Jesus and the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all that they do. May their every material and spiritual need be met, good measure and flowing over.

2) For the people of Iceland.

May all hearts harbored in Iceland turn with love toward God. May they know His Mercy, Healing and Truth; and may God provide generously for all their needs of body, mind and spirit.

Prayers and reflections on this page are from the Novena in Honor of St. Thorlac (2018)



St. Thorlák lived in Iceland from 1133-1193. At that time, Iceland was populated by poor farmers and seafarers, frequently subject to harsh climatic conditions and fluctuations in the availability of food. He himself came from a family in good social standing whose money ran out during a downturn in mercantile activity, and from complete poverty he went to live with the scholars at Oddi, who trained him for the priesthood. In his religious career, he was a deacon, a parish priest, a theological scholar, a Canon Regular of the Order of St. Augustine, a

consecrated abbot of a monastery and a bishop. In each setting, St. Thorlák conducted himself as anywhere else: in full obedience to God.

St. Thorlák never took his rank lightly, and felt the higher one rose, the greater his responsibility to live uprightly. In particular, he believed those in the clergy and public offices had the greatest burden of good living as examples for all to see. St. Thorlák tended many different walks of life among his flocks: peasants, married, single, prominent leaders, monks and fellow priests. He saw them all equally, as brothers and sisters in Christ, and expected no less from them.

Let Us Pray

Almighty God, St. Thorlák took great care to lead others to You in ways that were loving and gentle. He wished for everyone to live harmoniously according to Your plan, that where two or more gather in faith, You become present. May the pastors of Your Church follow St. Thorlák's example in their perseverance, forbearance and striving for concord. Help the people of Iceland to hear Your voice through these holy men, and not grieve them by chasing discord with Your Church and its teaching. Through Christ, our Lord. AMEN.

Brother Lawrence of the Resurrection (Quotations from The Practice of the Presence of God)



"We do not always have to be in church to be with God. We can make of our hearts an oratory where we can withdraw from time to time to converse with him there, gently, humbly, and lovingly. Everyone is capable of these familiar conversations with God, some more, some less. He knows what we can do." (62)

"My God, you are always close to me. In obedience to you, I must now apply myself to outward things. Yet, as I do, I pray that you will give me the grace of your presence. And to this end I ask that you will assist my work, receive its fruits as an offering to you, and all the while direct all my affections to you."

"That we ought not to be weary of doing little things for the love of GOD, who regards not the greatness of the work, but the love with which it is performed. That we should not wonder if, in the beginning, we often failed in our endeavors, but that at last we should gain a habit, which will naturally produce its acts in us, without our care, and to our exceeding great delight."

"We must know before we can love. In order to know God, we must often think of Him; and when we come to love Him, we shall then also think of Him often, for our heart will be with our treasure."

Lord Jesus, You have chosen Your priests from among us and sent them out to proclaim Your word and to act in Your Name. For so great a gift to Your Church, we give You praise and thanksgiving. We ask You to fill them with the fire of Your love that their ministry may reveal Your presence in the Church.

Since they are earthen vessels, we pray that Your power shine out through their weakness. In their afflictions let them *never be crushed*; in their doubts *never despair*; in temptation *never be destroyed*; in persecution *never abandoned*.

First decade: Eternal Father, we bring to You the souls of clergy, priests and religious. Immerse them in Your unfathomable mercy that they will be clean, healed, free and holy. Keep them in the embrace of Your merciful love and truth.

Second decade: Eternal Father, we bring to You the souls of clergy, priests and religious who are struggling with themselves and others. Immerse them in Your unfathomable mercy that they will be clean, healed, free and holy. Renew them in their identity, mission and relationship.

Third decade: Eternal Father, we bring to You the souls of cardinals and bishops, the clergy and all those in leadership of the Church, who have weighty responsibility. Immerse them in Your unfathomable mercy that they will be clean, healed, free, and holy. May the Sanctifier grant them wisdom and courage.

Fourth decade: Eternal Father, we bring to You the souls of clergy and religious persons who have grown lukewarm, discouraged, or duplicitous. Immerse them in Your unfathomable mercy that they will be clean, healed free, and holy. May the power of the Cross transfigure and raise them up.

Fifth decade: Eternal Father, we bring to You the souls of clergy, priests and religious persons who wholeheartedly strive to fulfill their vocation to radiate the love of the heart of Jesus. Immerse them in Your unfathomable mercy that they will be clean, healed, free, and holy. Keep them safe from the enemies of the priesthood and Church.

Closing Prayer: Eternal Father, in whom mercy is endless, and the treasury of compassion exhaustible, look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair, nor become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy Itself.
